



Ancient Gujarat, Personal Gold Signet Seal, 0.31g, with Brahmi legend "Sharavan ya?????" in scalloped border, with two 1 brackets attached at the back, Gupta-Kshatrapa period. Extremely fine, rare.

The grammar of the inscription suggests that the owner of this seal was a woman. Highly unusual as such.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 15,000-20,000

Ancient Malwa, Personal Copper Seal, 5.59g, with Brahmi legend "Shashtadalasya??????? ? ", Gupta-Kshatrapa period. Very 2 fine, rare.

The name is probably a reference to six-petal lotus, a prominent Vaishnavite symbol.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 8,000-10,000

3 Punch Marked, Attributed to Shakya Janapada, Silver Double Karshapna, 6.34q, Uniface, "Lumbine Hoard" type, Main punch of circle surrounded by five crescents on obverse (Rajgor series 33). Extremely fine, very rare.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 12,000-15,000















Punch Marked, Attributed to Shakya Janapada, Silver Double Karshapna, 6.62g, Uniface, "Lumbine Hoard" type, Bold punch of seven pellets around a circle in the centre; ancillary symbols punched randomly along the wedge-shaped flan on obverse (Rajgor series 33). Extremely fine, very rare.

Suddodhana Father of the Lord Buddha was chief of Shakya's. Their capital was known as Kapilavastu. Lumbini _ Vana the birth place of the Lord Buddha can be identified with Rummin _ Dei is located around 10 miles to the east of Kapilavastu.

Punch Marked, Attributed to Magadha Janapada, Silver 11/2 Shatamana? - Vimshatika, "Series 0", 5.40g, Uniface (Gupta & 6 Hardekar# type 019). Extremely fine.

7 Punch Marked, Attributed to Kashi Janapada, Silver Vimshatika, 5.00g, Uniface, Four geometric marks (Rajgor Series 55). Very fine, rare. Realised ` Estimate: ` 13,000-15,000

















8 Punch Marked, Attributed to Kashi Janapada, Silver Vimshatika, 4.87g, Uniface, Four geometric marks and minor bankers mark (Rajgor Series 55). Very fine, rare.

9 Taxila, Negama- Guild, Cast Copper, 5.19g, Pamcanekame = the five guilds, Obv: Large wheel, three arched chaitya above, Rev: Swastika flanked by Nandipadas, Kharoshthi legend "P(r)acalaka(m)ma" below (Piper# 1571). Extremely fine for type, very rare.

10 Yuezhi, Sapalbizes (Sapadbizes), Silver Hemidrachm, 1.66g, Obv: Helmeted bust to right, Greek legend "CA A BIZHC" around, Rev: Lion standing to right, crescent above, NANAIA to left and right. Very fine.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 5,000-6,000

11 Kushans, Kujula Kadphises, Silver Obol, 1.64g, "Heraus" type, struck in the Transoxiana/Bactria region, Obv: Diademed bust of Kujula Kadphises to right in pelleted border, Rev: King standing front, head to right, wearing nomadic dress, with left hand on hilt of sword and raising his right hand; crude Bactrian legend "HIAOY KOPhPhANOY" on either side (PAIC 1702). Very fine+, rare.

Kushans, Kanishka, Copper, 17.03g, "Sakyamuni Buddha" type, Obv: Bearded King offering at altar holding log spear, the king wears a peaked cap, long coat & trousers, scarf around the shoulders, a belt with a sword is girded around the waist, Greek legend around, Rev: Lord Sakyamuni Buddha standing facing holding robe with his left hand, ringh hand raised in Abhay Mudra, Greek legend "CAKAMANO BOY O" (Gobl 785, Piper# 1752). Very fine for type, extremely rare.



13 City State Bhadravati, Copper, 5.55g, Obv: Elephant to right, Ujjain symbol above, Rev: Tree-in-railing in centre with Brahmi legend "Bhadavatiye (faintly visible)" in the right field (Piper# 2464). About Very fine, very rare.

Bhadravati, modern Bhandakji is situated in Chandrapur District of Maharashtra State. Having very important place in the history of ancient India, many references of this historic city are found in the Puranic, Buddhist & Jain literature. The most interesting among these is the mention of an International Boudh Dhhama Sabha (Buddhist Religious Convention), hosted by the city some 2000 years ago.

Post Mauryan, Eastern Malwa, City State, Vidisha, Copper Alloyed, 9.73g, Uniface, Tree-in-railing retrograde Brahmi legend 14 "Vidisasa" on obverse (Pieper# 855). Very fine, rare.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 15,000-20,000

Tribal, Kunindas, Amoghabhuti, Copper, 4.08g, Obv: Deer standing to right towards Laksmi, square vase above, Rev: Six arched hill, 15 tree in railing, swastika, Nandipada, triangular headed (Pieper# 1239). Very fine, rare.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 4,000-5,000

Pre-Satavahana, Monarchical coinage of Vidrabha region, King Subena, Copper Alloyed, 6.63g, Obv: Man standing with bent 16 knees on a lotus, holding staff and water pot, small Shrivatsa to right, Brahmi legend "Raño Subena..." to left, inscribed vertically, Rev: Bull standing facing right, with a large wheel having arrowed spokes above its back. To right, a cockerel standard (Kukkuta Dhwaja) in railing (Pieper# 2451). Very fine, extremely rare.

Subena appears to be an independent local ruler in Eastern Vidarbha and his coins show great similarity with those of Suryamitra and Satyabhadra II, the two local rulers. We know Suryamitra was a close contemporary of Satavahana king Satakani. Subena was perhaps a slightly earlier ruler. His name indicates his association with river Bena, which was a major river in the region (present-day Wainganga).

Ancient Vidarbha, Satavahana, Bhon region, Uninscribed die-struck, Copper, 8.53g, "River Goddess' type, Obv: symbolic composition - wheel with arrow spokes, modified 'Ujjain' symbol, triangle-headed standard and representation of river goddess, standing facing with fish in one hand, Rev: Tree in railing within a dotted border partly visible (Unpublished in major sources). Very fine, very rare.

Coins of this type are sometimes found with Brahmi legend 'Siri Gola' on the reverse. They are often counterstruck over other specimens. The series constitutes one of the earliest inscribed coinages in the Deccan.

- Satavahanas, Tripuri/Eastern Malwa region, Siri Satakani, Lead, 4.66g, "Human figure" type, Obv: 'Ujjain' symbol with one orb 18 modified with crescent in centre; Brahmi legend clockwise "Raño Siri Satakanino" around, Rev: Human figure standing in centre, three-arched hill topped by an elephant to left, tree-in-railing to right and two wavy lines with fishes below. Extremely fine, extremely rare in this grade.
 - The legend on this coin ends in '-No' as a genitive case suffix (Satakanino) instead of the usual '-Sa'(Satakanisa). Although grammatically accurate, it is surprisingly not seen on any other type of Satavahana coins.

- Satavahanas, Vasishthiputra Sri Satakarni, Silver Drachma, 2.32g, "Portrait" type, Obv: Bust with curly long hair & prominent nose 19 and thick lips, wearing a high head ornament, Brahmi legend "Rano Vasithiputasa Siri Satakanisa" around Rev: Four orb Ujjayini symbol, six-arched hill with a crescent, Sun and river flowing below, Southern Brahmi - Tamil-Telugu / Prakrit legends around. Very fine, rare.

- 20 Satavahanas, Gotamiputa Siri Yajna Satakani, Silver Drachma, 2.17g, "Portrait Roman Head" type, Obv: Profile bust of the ruler, with short concentric head of hair (commonly known as the 'Roman Head') with head-ornament or Choodamani; Brahmi legend "... Satakanisa" around, Rev: Satavahana dynastic emblem in the centre, Southern Brahmi legend "Arahanaku... Hatakaniku" around. Very fine, very rare.
 - Realised ` Estimate: ` 8,000-10,000
- 21 Satavahanas, Gautamiputra Siri Satakani, counterstruck on a Drachma of Kshaharata Kshatrapa Nahapana, Silver Drachma, 2.27g, Obv: Traces of Nahapana's bust and traces of crude "Greco-Roman" legend around, overstruck by three arched hill with crescent symbol and Brahmi letters "Rano Gota..." to right, Rev: Ujjain symbol within dotted circle or dynastic emblem of the Satavahanas, traces of under type (Brahmi and Kharoshthi legends and thunderbolt-arrow symbol) visible underneath. Extremely fine.
 - Realised ` Estimate: ` 10,000-15,000
- 22 Satavahanas, Gotamputa Siri Siva Satakani, Lead, 9.15g, Bhokardan Region, "Lion" type, Obv: Maned Lion facing left, Brahmi legend "Rano Gotami....." around, Rev: Tree-in-railing, modified Ujjain symbol to left. Very fine, very rare.



Western Kshatrapas, Kshaharata house, Nahapana as 'Mahakshatrapa', Junnar region, lead, 15.98g, "Lion" type, Obv: Majestic 23 lion with mane, standing in front of a plough-headed standard in railing, placed above triangle-headed standard, with Shrivatsa near its mouth; three-arched hill below belly and curvy line below platform. Brahmi legend "Raño Mahakhatapasa Nahapanasa" around, Rev: Thunderbolt, long arrow and a strung bow-and-arrow symbols (Fishman 8.3). Extremely fine, extremely rare in this grade. Sometimes around or after 70AD, the Kshaharatas spread their rule deep into the Satavahana territory, marking the apogee of their conflict with the Satavahanas. Nahapana assumed the title of 'Mahakshatrapa' at this time consolidating his alliance with other local rulers like Vasithiputa Isamula. Lion-type coins were struck at Junnar, the regional capital, in continuation of the Satavahana coinage but now with Nahapana's name and emblems. This astonishingly well-preserved piece is probably the best ever found in the large denomination lead series. It is well struck and has a complete legend and a full representation of features like the lion and the dynastic emblem on the reverse.

Kumar TOTGE 2024: Class I, var. A.1). About Extremely fine, rare.

Kumar TOTGE 2024: Class III, var. A.2.1). Deep bold strike, about uncirculated, exceedingly rare in this grade.

Guptas, Samudragupta, Gold Dinar, 7.77g, "Javelin" type, Obv: Nimbate king, standing left in Tribhanga pose, holding standard / javelin and sacrificing over altar, Garuda standard behind altar and Brahmi legend "Samarasatavitatavijayo jitaripurajito divam jayati" partially visible around, Rev: Nimbate Goddess Ardoksho seating on throne holds a diadem in her right hand and cornucopia in her left hand, Brahmi legend "Parakramah" in the right field (S. Kumar TOTGE 2024: Class II, var. A.9). Extremely fine+, very rare in high grade. Realised ` Estimate: ` 1,00,000-1,50,000

Alchon Huns, Lakhana Udayaditya, Silver Drachma, 3.30g, Obv: Diademed Hunnic bust wearing crown with two crescents, earring 28 and necklace; Brahmi legend "La Shri" engraved retrograde to above right. A composite symbol of Lion's head surmounted by a trident with ribbons in front of the bust, Rev: Mostly blank with traces of obverse impression intaglio. Extremely fine, rare.

Rashtrakutas in Western India, Gunatunga, Silver Dramma, 0.39g, Obv: profile bust of king facing right, Rev: Brahmi legend "Sri Guna Tunga" partly visible. Very fine, very rare.

These coins were earlier wrongly attributed to Sankaragana, 6th century Kalachuri king of Mahishmati. Recent reappraisal suggests they are Rashtrakuta silver issues from North-West and North Maharashtra.



32 Medieval Maharashtra, Probably Early Rashtrakutas, Uninscribed Silver Dramma, 1.07g, Obv: Three-quarters profile bust of a man sporting moustache and a 'warrior' hairstyle, Rev: Potbellied Kubera, god of wealth, seated facing on a lotus, flanked by two female attendants (one clearly visible). Very fine, exceedingly rare.

Arare and unusual type found in North Maharashtra and Khandesh areas, which according to some scholars were the homeland of the Rashtrakutas. Their first capital 'Mayurakhindi' has tentatively been identified with the Markanda fort in the Satmala range of North Western Maharashtra.



33 Gangas of Talakadu, Gold Gajapati Varaha, 3.74g, Obv: An ornate Elephant standing to right, Kannada legend above Elephant, Rev: Scroll work (Mitch# 193). About uncirculated, rare. Realised ` Estimate: ` 50,000-60,000



Eastern Chalukyas, Attributed to Post-Vishnuvardhana Period, Uninscribed Alloyed Copper, 1.78g, "Vishnukundin" type, Obv: 34 Lion with gaping mouth facing right, Shrivatsa symbol to right, Rev: a four-spoked when and an elephant goad (Ankusha) within a rayed-circle (Not listed in major publications). Extremely fine, rare.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 4,000-5,000 Imperial Cholas, Uttama Chola, Base Silver Kahavanu, 3.62g, Obv: Within border of dots, under Parasol flanked by 2 flywhisks, the 35

following figures from left to right, a lampstand, a strung bow, a Tiger, 2 fishes & another lampstand, Rev: Devnagari legend "U tta ma/ Cho lah" within border of dots (K Ganesh # 1.3). Very fine.

Very fine, very rare. Nandi was the lanchhana (dynastic emblem) of the Nolambas, who thrived as feudatories to the Rashtrakutas in 9th and 10th century CE.

Kadambas of Hangal, Gold Fanam, 0.38g, Obv: Lion walking to right facing back, Rev: Peacock facing right. Extremely fine, rare.

38 Kadambas of Goa, Jayakeshi Deva, Gold Gadyana, 4.43g, inscribed in Kannada and Devnagari legend, Obv: Lion standing with raised forepaw, facing left. Cyclical year "Prajapati" inscribed in Kannada in front of the Lion, Crescent and Sun symbols above, Rev: Devanagari legend "Sri Sapta/Kotisha labdhavara/Vira Jayakesi/Deva Malavara/mari". Extremely fine, exceedingly rare.



At the top of the arch is a Keerti-mukha figurine, a typical architectural element. Kneeling Narasimha decorates the pedestal bases. God wearing tapering crown (Karanda-mukuta), Crocodile shaped ear-ornaments (Makara-kundalas), Bhuja-keerthi (arm ornaments), anklets, a medallion, necklaces, and other jewelled attributes shown by a flowing array of dots and lines. He holds Shankha and Chakra in his upper hands, and makes the gesture of benevolence (Varada-mudra), and kati hasta mudra symbolizing the dispensing of boons and the protection with lower right hand, Rev: Devanagari legend in three lines "Sri/Krishna R /ya" within a double circular border (Mitch# 1088). This extremely rare and important coin is perhaps one of the 30000 coins specially struck by Krishnadeva Raya in 1516, to perform a Kanakabhishekam ("Shower of Gold") ceremony at the Tirupati temple, to thank the Lord for his victory over the Kondavidu and Gajapati dynasties of neighbouring Andhra-Orissa country. It shows a truly splendorous depiction of Venkateshwara, in all its jewelled glory on obverse. As compared with it the simplicity of the reverse stands out as a testimony to the King's devotion and subservience to the Lord. A numismatic masterpiece!

In England, the gold ryals (rose-nobles) with a 120-grain standard were introduced in 1465 AD, which is equivalent to 7.8 gm. In May 1522, an official proclamation recognized the circulation of foreign gold in England and fixed the values of certain coins. During Krishnadeva Raya's reign, the 120-grain gold ryals were in use as English currency. This may explain the rationale behind the Gold Honnu weight of 7.8gm

> A small stash of Vijayanagara gold coins was discovered in May 2024 near Hospet, about 14 km from Hampi, the capital of the Vijayanagara Empire. The hoard featured just a few 'Dodda Honnu', no more than can be counted on one's fingers, and about 150 Pratapa and Varaha gold coins issued by Krishnadeva Raya and his successor, Achyutaraya. Most of the Varaha and Pratapa coins were poorly made, with less than 10% being in collectible condition. Golden chance to acquire for collectors.

Humayun sought refuge with Shah Hussain Arghun of Sindh when his brother Kamran deserted him and went for Kabul. The relations with Shah Hussain were strained, however Humayun managed to secure a base in North Sindh. Here, his son Akbar was born in Umarkot (Sind).

Known specimens of Shahrukhis struck at Thatta are from his second reign. Sindh continued to be held by the Arghuns, however as they were a weak state they possibly accepted the sovereignty of Humayun. This specimen is dateless but bears close similarity to a coin dated AH963 which is listed on Zeno (#85168).



Adoni, later known as Imtiazgarh is a town in Kurool district of Andhra Pradesh. The fort of Adoni was a very strong Military post of Adil Shahi Sultans of Bijapur, having a strong Garrison of 30000 Troops. The Mughals took the fortress from Sidi Masud, the commander of Sultan Sikandar Adil Shah after a protracted siege. During the siege, two types of coins appear to have been issued, either by the Mughals to pay the troops, or by Sidi Masud, to mark his acceptance of the Mughal suzerainty. One of them has the mint-name 'Dar al-Zafar Qila'a Advani' while the other has only 'Adoni'. Both are extremely rare, only known from 3-4 extant pieces. This coin combines the two reverses with mint-names and thus is a mule but bringing together reverse dies of a short-lived issue. Soon afterwards Adoni was renamed 'Imtiyazgarh' and became a fairly productive mint under the rule of local Nawabs.






