

Punch Marked, Upper Krishna valley, Wai-Sultanpur region of Western Maharashtra, sometimes attributed to Ashmaka/Kuntala Janapada, Silver, 6.46g, Obv: Pulley like symbol without Treskelis symbol between the prongs, Rev: Traces of a similar symbol (Rajgor 502-509). *About extremely fine, very rare.*

The 'pulley'-type punch-marked coinage is perhaps the earliest coinage in Deccan. The reuse of offer coins, as evident in this specimen, is an important insight into the use of these coins and a rare feature to be preserved in this manner.

Bactrian legend "Shaonano Shao Bazodeo Koshano" around, Rev: Nimbate Shiva/Wesho in Dhoti, standing reclining against Nandi the bull, holding a trident in one hand and a diadem in the other, Bactrian legend "OESho" to right and Tamgha to the left his head (Goebl# 528). 19 **Post Mauryan Tribal Monarchies, Pauravas, Mahindramitra**, Copper 2.76g, Obv: Lion seated right, Brahmi legend "(*Rano*) *Poravasa Mahidamitasa*" above, Rev: Tree-in railing with Kharoshthi letter and Indradvaja around (Pieper# 1386). *Extremely rare*.

The Pauravas were probably the same people as Porus, who fought against Alexander the Great on the Jhelum River. Their coins are amongst the rarest of the so-called 'tribal' issues.

Mitra rulers of Ancient Punjab, Bhanumitra, Copper, 4.20g, Obv: Standing male figure (Mahakal?) holding a staff in one hand and the other holding a water pot, traces of Kharosthi legend "Rano Bhanumitasa" to left, Rev: Elephant with raised trunk advancing left; traces of Brahmi legend "Rano Bhanumitasa" above (Allan BMCAI, Pl. XLIII, no. 2). Very rare.

The bilingual coins of the Mitra rulers of Punjab are among the rarest of the indigenous monarchical coins of north India.

21 Magha dynasty in North Chhattisgarh, Baghelkhand region, Vashishthiputra Shivamagha, Alloyed Copper, 4.28g, Obv: Bull seated recumbent facing right, Brahmi legend "(Rajño) Vasithiputa...", Rev: Indistinct symbol within a rayed circle (Not listed in major publications). Very fine, extremely rare.

The Maghas came to prominence in the aftermath of the Satavahanas and gradually moved to the North, ultimately basing themselves in Kaushambi by 4th century. They were one of the dynasties subdued by Samudra Gupta, as mentioned in his Allahabad pillar inscription. Very little is known about the early Magha rulers apart from a few seals and coins.

22 **City State, Madavika**, Bronze, 7.38g, Obv: Brahmi legend "*Madavike*", Rev: Tree in railing and other symbols faintly visible (Pieper# 819). *Uncleaned, very fine for type, extremely rare*.

23 **Ceylon**, Anonymous, Copper, 6.77g, Obv: Goddess standing facing front, Rev: Shrivatsa and ancillary symbols (Mitch# MAC 5049). *Extremely fine for type, very rare.*

Satavahanas, **Tripuri region**, **Siri Sati**, Lead, 12.95g, "**Elephant**" type, Obv: Elephant walking to right, river with Fishes below; Brahmi legend "*Raño Siri Satisa*" above, Rev: Female figure standing between two three arched hills, flanked by Ujjain symbol to left and tree in railing to right (Bhandare tpr-4). *Very fine*, *extremely rare*.

Tripuri marked the northernmost limit of the Satavahana empire. It was won from the local Datta kings by Satakani and subsequently ruled by his son Sati Siri. However, the Satavahana occupation did not last long. This makes coins of Sati Siri from this region extremely rare. He employed the characteristic feature of the local coinage – a standing human figure – but added other typically Satavahana features such as elephant to the type repertoire.

26 Satavahanas, Silver **Drachma** (5), "**Portrait**" type, Obv: Bust to right, Brahmi legend around, Rev: Four orb Ujjayini symbol, six-arched hill with a crescent, Sun and river flowing below, Southern Brahmi - Tamil-Telugu / Prakrit legends around. *Pierced. Fine to very fine.* 5 coins.



- 27 **Pallavas of Kanchi**, Uninscribed Alloyed Copper, 3.26g, Obv: Bull standing facing right, a crescent and Shrivatsa above, Rev: Two-masted Ship (Similar to Krishnamurthy 11). *Very fine+*, *exceedingly rare*.
 - Pallava coins depicting ships stand a testament to the maritime power of the dynasty and the importance of trade for the Pallava kingdom. The types borrow directly from earlier coins, such as those of the Satavahanas and the Salankayanas. In a wider perspective, these coins are very important evidential components for the history of India's naval prowess during the Ancient Period and the importance of the Eastern Seaboard in forging commercial and political ties to countries across the Bay of Bengal and further, as far as the South China Sea. **No coins with a two-mast ship have been published before.** Krishnamurthy lists a single coin (no. 11) said to have been found in the North Arcot district but the ship it bears has a single mast so it would well be a river ship, not necessarily a seafaring vessel.

Very fine+, very rare.

The rare variety of the parasol type, with Lakshmi advancing left. Small test mark otherwise extremely fine, extremely rare.

(Similar to MCSI 184-185). *Extremely fine*. extremely rare.

'Vishamasiddhi', meaning the one who keeps succeeding even against adversities, was a title adopted by Vishnuvardhana, who was appointed as the governor of Vengi by his brother the Chalukya emperor Satyashraya Pulakesi. He was responsible for carving out an independent 'Eastern' Chalukya kingdom which lasted for nearly 600 years.

35 **Pandyas of Madurai**, **Srimara Srivallabha**, Copper **Kasu**, 4.07g, Obv: Two vertical Fishes (Pandyan Royal insignia), Rev: "**Avanibha Sekaran Kolakalan**" in Grantha Tamil legend (Later Pandya Coins by A Sitharaman Coin No. 1). Very fine+, exceedingly rare.

The King Srimara Srivallabha and his Queen

King Srimara famously known as the "Parachakra Kolahala" ("the Confounder of the Circle of his Enemies"), also bears many other titles like "Ekveeran", "Parasakra Kolakalan", "Avanibhaskaran". He was among the greatest King of early Pandyas who concord Shri Lanka, he also defeated Pallavas, Cholas, Gangas and many others. Sinnamanur Copper plates are the major source of activities of this grate Pandya King. The famous cave painting at Chittanvachal (Pudukkottai) believed to be King Srimara Srivallabha and his Queen. The present coin is exceedingly rare and historically very important coin of Pandyas with Tamil legend. First ever appearing in any Auction House.

Chandella inscriptions also credit Kirttivarman with other victories, stating that he vanquished several enemies and that his commands "reached the borders of the sea".





Comparable Vijayanagar coins were found in a hoard at Harmal in Pernem taluka, North Goa. These are extremely rare and were virtually unknown till published in an article in 'Numismatic Studies'.





'Nagar' was a short form for Haidarnagar, which was the name given to Bednur, the capital of the Nayakas of Ikkeri or Keladi, by Tipu's father Hyder Ali. Nagar was special for Tipu because he wrested in back from the British in 1783 when Col. Matthews occupied it briefly during the first Anglo-Mysore War. This was Tipu's first major victory as a military commander.

The mint at Nagar is the only mint of Tipu which struck coins for every year in his reign, including coins dated in his last regnal year dated AM1227, when he died only a month into it. Silver coins struck at Nagar are some of rarest and most sought after coins amongst Tipu's issues. Double, one and half rupee are known and all are struck from his 4th to 7th year.




