

Ancient



1 Punch Marked, Attributed to Shakya Janapada, Silver Double Karshapna, 7.19g, Uniface, "Lumbine Hoard" type, Main punch of circle surrounded by five crescents on obverse (Rajgor series 33). Extremely fine, very rare.

Realised ` Estimate: ` 15,000-20,000

Punch Marked, Upper Krishna valley, Wai-Sultanpur region of Western Maharashtra, attributed to 'Ashmaka-Kuntala 2 Janapada, Silver, 6.90g, Uniface, Pulley'-like symbol without 'treskelis' symbol between the prongs on obverse (Rajgor 502-509). With original patina deep punch. Very fine+, very rare.

The 'pulley'-type punch-marked coinage is perhaps the earliest coinage in Deccan, mainly known from three large hoards found in the vicinity of Wai, Western Maharashtra. The most recent of these hoards was found in 1990s. Nearly all coins found in the hoard were cleaned to reveal a clean silver appearance. Hardly any survive preserving the original patina of the hoard. This is one such piece and therefore of exceptional rarity.

Post Mauryan, Local Taxila, Uninscribed die-struck Copper Heavy, 11.15g, "Biface series -Symbolic" type, Obv: Symbolic 4 configuration - clockwise from top left, a spear/standard with ribbons, three-arched Chaitya with crescent, triangle-headed standard, open cross, Rev: Symbolic configuration - clockwise from top left, Shrivatsa, three-arched Chaitya with crescent, Swastika, Nandipada (Similar to PAIC 1513 but of heavier weight). Deep bold strike, patinated, about uncirculated, extremely rare in this grade.

Indo Greek, Menander, Copper Square Heavy Unit, 41.83q, Obv: Bust of Athena in Boiotian helmet to right, Greek legend 5 "BASILEOS SOTEROS MENANDROY" around, Rev: Horse rearing to right, monogram below, Kharoshthi legend "Maharajasa tratarasa Menamdrasa" (Hoover# 199). Very fine+, extremely rare.

Kushans, Kanishka, Copper Tetradrachm, 16.21g, "Sakhamana Boddo", "Transparent Garment" type, Purushpura-Taxila Mint, 6 Obv: King standing, offering to fire altar, Rev: Lord Buddha standing in Abhay Mudra, Transparent garment (Gobl #786) seen. Very fine for type, very rare.



7 Kushan, Huvishka, Gold Dinar, 7.75g, Obv: Draped bust of the king to left, wearing helmet and diadem, and holding sceptres in both hands, Bactrian legend "...NANO ShAO OOESh..." around, Rev: God Mao (Moon) standing right holding diadem & sceptre in hand, Tamgha on right (Goebl# 146). Very fine, rare.

Very fine, rare.



Kshatrapas of Kashmir (Chuksa), Zeionises as Mahakshatrapas, Silver Tetradrachm, 10.97g, Obv: Scythian king advancing to right on horseback, holding Elephant goad, Nandipada to left, monogram to right, Rev: Scythian king standing right, crowned by Tyche standing to left holding wreath & cornucopia. Monogram to left, Kharoshthi legend "Manigulasaputrasa Mahachatrapasa Jihuniasa" around (Hoover# 722). Very fine.

Mahakshatrapa issue of this ruler are extremely rare.

Pleasant specimen with almost complete details and legend. Extremely fine for type, extremely rare.





Maharathi, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalaseema Upper Krishna Valley region, Maharathi Mahahathi, Lead, 5.40g, Obv: Elephant standing on pedestal facing left, crescent above; Brahmi legend *Maharathisa...* above. Rev: six arched Chaitya with swastika above, river below, sacrificial pillar to left and palm tree to right, all enclosed in a rectangular border (Unpublished in major publications). *Deep bold strike, extremely fine, very rare.*

The fabric and metallic composition of the coin is very similar to Pallava coins so it is plausible that it was struck in a southern mint, closer to the Pallava domains. The Vishnukundin and Pallava dynasties fought over the control of paddy-rich heartlands of Andhra Pradesh.

Brahmi legend stat at 10'clock "Jayatimahitalam Skandagupta Sudhanvi", Rev: Goddess Lakshmi seated on lotus holding a lotus in one hand and a noose in the other, Brahmi legend "Sri Skandaguptah" to right and Tamgha to left (S Kumar TOGE pg 351/352). King and Queen type of Skandagupta is one of the exceedingly rare coins of Gupta Empire. Only few are known in private Collection.

Extremely fine.

Both sides within a circle of large dotted border (ECB# SAM3.2). About extremely fine.

Medieval Maharashtra, Probably Early Rashtrakutas, Uninscribed Silver Dramma, 1.15g, Obv: Three-quarters profile bust of a man sporting moustache and a 'warrior' hairstyle, Rev: Potbellied Kubera, God of wealth, seated facing on a lotus, flanked by two female attendants (one clearly visible). *Patinated, very fine, extremely rare*.

Arare and unusual type found in North Maharashtra and Khandesh areas, which according to some scholars were the homeland of the Rashtrakutas. Their first capital 'Mayurakhindi' has tentatively been identified with the Markanda fort in the Satmala range of North Western Maharashtra.

Bahmanis of Gulbarga



This extremely rare and unusual issue was first published by Ken Wiggins in ONSNL no. 118, in 1989. However, he did not give any details as to what its provenance was and why was it significant, beyond the possibility that it may have been a pattern.

The British government, particularly after the transfer of India's governance from the East India Company in 1860, had been very keen on consolidating the British rupee as the only currency in all of India. It actively discouraged princely states from having their own coinage, which was considered 'inferior' and prone to be substandard as it was privately managed. The princes on the other hand, pushed such pressures back by actively considering using machines to produce coins, so that their currency was as good as British

As the date VS 1930 suggests, Nawanagar appears to have tried issuing a silver coinage using machines in early 1870s. It certainly wasn't alone – its neighbours Kutch, Junagarh and Radhanpur had all experimented around the same time. Machine-struck Copper 3-Dokdo coins bearing VS 1928 are known and 1-Kori pieces bearing VS 1934 as well.

For some reasons, the experiment did not take off. Possible reasons include an active interference from the Govt of India in importing the machinery or inadequate supplies of silver to run the mint. Wiggins has remarked on its similarity in design with the 5-Kori coins of Kutch to hazard a guess that it was probably struck in the mint at Bhuj. However, there is no evidence to this suggestion. Whatever be the reason, the coins remain exceptionally rare—this is perhaps the third piece ever known.

During the Second Anglo-Maratha War the Maratha armies in north India were decisively defeated by the British under Lord Lake who captured the city of Delhi on 11 September 1803. On 30 December 1803 (AH1218/Ry.46), Daulat Rao Sindhia signed the Treaty of Surji-Anjangaon. Under its clauses, Hisar, Panipat, Rohtak, Rewari, Gurgaon, Ganges-Jumna Doab, the Delhi-Agra region, parts of Bundelkhand, Broach, some districts of Gujarat and the fort of Ahmadnagar were all ceded to the British.

Although technically, Delhi, called Shahjahanabad on the coins, was the nominal capital of the Mughal Empire, it was brought effectively under British suzerainty, as persuasively argued by Paul Stevens and Sanjay Garg, based on government documents preserved in both London and Delhi.

The present coin must have been struck immediately after Lord Lake's conquest of Delhi as it has a small lion, presumably standing for British authority, added to the normal mint marks of Delhi. This is an exceptional variety, as only two or three other coins with the additional lion are known and bear a very differently executed lion on them.




