

The Agacha *janapad*a was a post-Mauryan tribal republic in the eastern Punjab, with its capital at the ancient site of Agrodaka (modern-day Agroha).

Unknown city state in northern India, Copper, 0.99g, Obverse: Brahmi legend "Shosheniye" arranged clockwise, Reverse: Crescent (Not listed in any catalogue). Very rare.

This rare type was earlier misattributed to a Kausambi trade guild. However, the legend *Shosheniye* indicates it was issued by a hitherto unknown city called Shosheni.









25 Mitra rulers of Ancient Punjab, Bhanumitra, Copper, 4.21q, Obv: Standing male figure (Mahakal?) holding a staff in one hand and the other holding a water pot, traces of Kharoshthi legend "Rano Bhanumitasa" to left, Rev: Elephant with raised trunk advancing left; traces of Brahmi legend "Rano Bhanumitasa" above (Allan BMCAI, Pl. XLIII, no. 2). Very fine, very rare.

The bilingual coins of the Mitra rulers of Punjab are among the rarest of the indigenous monarchical coins of north India. Very rare.

The coins of Maharathis in the Marathwada – Vidarbha region are a recent discovery. The issues of Talathati, Sirimata and Siva Vijhasati have been published, however they are all of arsenical copper alloy. This coin, of the same typology as these issues, is of lead. Although the legend is truncated it is certain that this is an issue of an unknown ruler whose name begins with 'Data'.

Bhanughosha was most likely a local tribal chief who ruled contemporarily to Huvishka, as evident from the fabric of his coins.





Towards the latter part of his reign, Akbar sporadically issued coins with the name of the denomination written on them. For silver coins, this was in Ilahi 47 and 48 but the practice had started a few years earlier. Copper coins with denominations 'Nisfi' (Half Dam), 'Ruba'i or 'Damra' (1/4 Dam), 'Damri' (1/8<sup>th</sup> Dam) but without any mint names were struck from AH992 / Ilahi 32 onwards. Later, when Akbar issued the 'Tanka' or '2 Dam' coin, it's fraction were struck with the mention of the denomination as a part (fourth, eighth, sixteenth etc.) of the 'Tanka'.

The 'Jital' was the smallest copper coin instituted by Akbar but according to the 'Ain-i Akbari' of Abu'l Fazal, it was only a denomination of account. It was equivalent to 1/25<sup>th</sup> of the Dam, thus weighing lower than the 'Damri'. Even though mentioned by Abu'l Fazal as an 'imaginary division', extremely rare specimens show that the denomination was indeed struck during Akbar's reign. A couple were published several years ago in the Oriental Numismatic Society Newsletter by the renowned collector of Mughal coins, the late Dilip Shah. A couple others are in private hands. This is by far a most desirably preserved specimen with legends on both sides legible and intact.

Mughal forces under Mir Jumla invaded Cooch Behar in 1661 and stayed there until 1663. During the period Prana Narayan fled to Bhutan. Mir Jumla made the city of Cooch Behar his base and changed its name to 'Alamgirnagar. He also issued coins in the name of the Mughal emperor on the local standard and in the local script but using the Persian language. This particular coin is particularly important in having a clear regnal year pertaining to Aurangzeb. The Mughal invasion ended up as a disaster, with many not making it back. This issue, which fits into both the Cooch Behar and Mughal series, is exceedingly rare, especially with date visible. Although Cooch Behar coins continued to be struck on the same weight standard, those from the Mughal period onwards, especially during the period of British influence, tend to be referred to as half rupees or even Narayani rupees, rather than half tankas. From here on, therefore, they are called half rupees even though there is no metrological reason for doing so.

The earliest minting activity on behalf of the Peshwa is known to have been undertaken during the short and ill-fated reign of Peshwa Narayan Rao when Dullabh Set Govindji, a banker of Pune was given a license to operate a mint. The coins he produced were to be rupees and mohurs, to be known as 'Shet shahi' coins after his name. All coins of this early issue are very rare. They bear the RY of the Mughal emperor, with his name spelled as 'Shah Alam'. The calligraphy is of a good standard and the mint-name is inscribed as 'Muhiyabad' with 'Y' and 'A' of '-abad' being ligated. Subsequent issues, struck after the murder of the Peshwa in 1773 and installation of the 'Council of Ministers' in charge, had the name 'Shah Ali Gauhar' on them.

In middle 18th century, the Marathas launched a series of campaigns to exact tributes in the "Carnatic" region. The money that flowed back into Maharashtra as a result of these consisted mainly of Arcot rupees. As such the Arcot rupee became a very popular currency in Maharashtra. Many mints struck copies with same design sometimes suitably modifying it. A series of Arcot rupees with Trisul symbol is known from Maharashtra with mint name "Arcot". These coins are sometimes identified as "Danish" because of a debatable reference by Uno Berger Janssen. The coin offered here is a direct successor of these coins but the mint name here clearly ends in "- Ganw" (Gaon). The find spots of all these "Trisul" marked rupees broadly overlap with territories held by the Patwardhan sardars who played a crucial role in the "Carnatic" campaigns. It is plausible that they were instrumental in the Advent and spread of the "Arcot" rupee and its derivatives in the Deccan. Tasgaon was a major Patwardhan jagir town and it is plausible that this rupee was struck there.

This is an unusual type of coin of the Nizam where the name of a Hindu deity is used as a mint-mark or a signifier for an issuer / licensee who farmed the minting rights. The Nizam was reduced to a powerless ruler after his defeat at the battle of Rakshas Bhuvan in 1763. 


