- 1 Punch Marked, Attributed to Kuntala Janapada- Wai series, Silver ½ Karshapana, 1.62g, Uniface, "Pulley" type, without Treskellis symbol (Rajgor Series 29). *Extremely fine, very rare.*

Sold ` Estimate: 13,000-15,000

- 2 Punch Marked, Attributed to Saurashtra Janpada, Silver 1/4 Karshapana, 0.83g, Uniface, Obv: Tree symbol surrounded circle and taurine symbol. (Rajgor Series 18). *Very fine.*

Sold ` Estimate: ` 1,000-1,500

- 3 Punch Marked, Attributed to Surasena Janapada, Silver ½ karshapana, 1.76 g, Uniface, Fish left over stylized Lion left, Taurine symbol to left on obverse (P. Anne van't Haaff, Saurashtra Surasena Silver Punchmarked Coinage, Type 2.6.2 this coin illustrated). *Very rare.*

The Fish and Lion facing left is very rare in Surasena. This specimen is the first to be offered in an Indian auction.

- 5 Eran, Copper Karshapana, 8.89 g, Uniface, Five punches, Elephant walking left, Indradhvaja, 4-orbed Ujjain symbol, six-armed symbol and river (Pieper# 465). *Very fine.*

- 6 Taxila, Copper, 2.48g, Uniface, Local Coinage, Swastika turning left in round incuse (Unlisted in Pieper). *Very fine, rare.*

- 7 Taxila, Copper (3), 3.40g, 2.75g, 1.32g, Local Coinage. *Very fine to very fine+. 3 coins.*

- 8 Post-Mauryan, Ujjain region, Copper, 2.88g, Obv: Humped Bull walking to right in front of tree in railing, Bull, triangular headed standard flanked by taurine above, Rev: Four orb Ujjaini symbol (worn out). *Fine.*

- 9 Post-Mauryan, Ancient Malwa, Ujjain region, Copper, 3.13g, Uniface, Fish standard in railing, with Sun symbol above platform to right (Unlisted in major publications). *Very fine, extremely rare.*

The fish standard is one of the rarities in ancient Indian coinage.

- 10 Post-Mauryan, Central Malwa, Eran-Vidisha region, Uninscribed Copper, 1.65g, Obv: River with fishes, duck and turtle swimming, horse above, tree in railing to right; Ujjain symbol, Swastika and triangle-headed standard above, Rev: Nandyavarta symbol. *Extremely fine for type, very rare.*

The coin is in exceptional condition for its size and denomination. A symbol of horse was not documented earlier in coins of similar series.

- 11 Post Mauryan, Vidarbha region, Kutapada, Copper, 3.60g, Obv: Elephant advancing right with trunk raised, Brahmi legend "Rano Kutapa(dasa)" above, Rev: Bold nandipada (Unlisted in Pieper and Mitchiner). *Very fine for type, rare.*

Kutapada is a recently discovered post-Mauryan ruler of Vidarbha.

- 12 Post Mauryan Monarchical Coinage, Ancient Betwa valley, Erach region, Sahasrasena, Copper, 1.51g, struck in hybrid fashion, Obv: Three punches – palm tree on hill in centre, Brahmi legend "Rajno Sa(ha)" to right and srasenasa to left, Rev: Sacrificial pillar or Yupa in a railing (die-struck). *Extremely fine, rare.*

- 13 Post Mauryan, Panchala, Bhadrashosh, Base Alloyed, Kaushambi Region, 1.20g, Obv: Goddess Lakshmi standing on lotus with one hand raised, Rev: A single punch including Panchala dynastic symbol on top row and Brahmi legend 'Bhadaghosasa' on bottom. *Very fine.*

- 14 Post Sunga, Mathura, Vishnumitra, Copper, 4.88g, Obv: Goddess Lakshmi standing facing with one arm raised, Brahmi legend "Vishnumitas" above, Rev: Traces of Elephants standing (Pieper# 1033). *Very Rare.*

- 15 Dattas of Ancient Eastern Malwa, Tripuri region, Uninscribed Lead, 3.09g, Obv: Swastika with taurines attached to the end of each arm, Rev: Tree in railing. *Extremely fine, rare.*

The obverse symbol is characteristic of the Datta dynasty, which flourished in the immediate pre- Satavahana period in Eastern Malwa. Larger units of the same type bear legends of Datta kings such as Ajadatta, Bhavadatta etc.

- 16 Post Sunga Monarchial, Ayodhya, Ayumitra, Copper, 6.83g, Bull facing to left spear ahead on obverse (Piper# 13). *Fine.*

- 17 City State, Nandinagar, Copper, 6.98g, Uniface, Brahmi legend "Nadinagara" on obverse (Shankar Tiwari, Prachya Pratibha, Vol. XII, 1-2 (1984), p. 77). *Very fine, very rare.*

Only a handful of specimens are known. Extremely Rare. Nandinagar has been identified with the ancient site of Nadner, located on the banks of Narmada river in Hoshangabad district, MP.

- 18 City State, Erikacha, Copper, 4.51g, Uniface, 5 punches, Brahmi legend "Erikacha", Horse standing left with one foot raised, srivatsa, tree in railing, and 4-orbed Ujjain symbol (M.L. Gupta, Erich an Ancient City on River Betwa, 43). *Very fine, very rare.*

- 19 Tribal, Audumbara tribe of ancient Punjab, Rudradasa, Copper, 1.92g, Obv: Temple with trishul to right, Brahmi legend, Rev: Audumbara tree with elephant to right, Kharoshthi legend (HGC 12, 835). *Rare.*

- 20 Tribal, Vemaka tribe of ancient Punjab, Copper, 1.52g, Obv: Bull standing right with swastika above, Kharoshthi legend around, Rev: Elephant standing left (Handa pl. XXXIV, no. 4). *Extremely rare.*

Only 2-3 specimens are known. This variety is unlisted, with the Bull and Elephant facing the opposite direction to the usual type.

- 21 Tribal Vrishnis of Haryana / Punjab, Jayasamstha, Copper, 1.46g, Obv: Twelve spoked wheel, Rev: Brahmi legend in two lines "Jaya / Samstha" (Handa (read as 'Jiyasa / Jayasa') p. 143). *Very fine for type, extremely rare.*

Vrishni coins of this type were first reported by Handa and Swami Omananda Saraswati from sites like Sunet near Ludhiana in Punjab. On the coins published by Handa the legend was not very clear, but here it is clearly read as 'Jayasamstha', with an anuswara on the letter Sa. A number of personal names with highly Sanskritized renderings are known on these coins and Jayasamstha appears to be one of them.

- 24 YUEZHI Tribe, Arseiles, Silver Hemidrachm, 1.07g, Obv: Helmeted and draped bust right, name around Rev: Lion standing right, crescent and above (R. Senior A4.1). *Uncleaned, very fine, rare.*

- 25 Indo Greeks, Menander I, Silver Drachma, 2.42g, Obv: Diademed heroic bust of king, wearing aegis & brandishing spear, Greek legend "BASILEOS SOTEROS MENANDROY", Rev: Athena Promachos standing left brandishing thunderbolt & aegis, monogram to right, Kharoshthi legend "Maharajasa rajarajasa tratarasa Menamdrasa" (Hoover# 189). *Very fine+.*

- 27 Indo Greeks, Apollodotos I, Silver Square Drachma, 2.39g, Obv: Elephant to right Greek legend "BASILEOS APPOLLOTOTOY SOTERS" around, Rev: Humped Bull to right Kharoshthi legend "Maharajasa Apaladatasa Tratarasa" around (Pieper# 1151). *Very fine+*.

- 28 Indo Greeks, Eukratides, Silver Obol, 0.64g, Obv: Diademed bust of king facing right, Rev: Two 'Pilei' (conical caps) and palm fronds, Greek legend "BACILEOC EUKRATIDOU" on either side (MAC# 1720). *Very fine*.

- 29 Indo Greeks, Antimachos II, Silver Drachma, 2.41g, Obv: King wearing diadem and helmet on horse rearing right, Kharoshthi legend "Maharajasa Jayadharasa Amtimakasa" around, Rev: Winged Goddess Nike advancing left, holding palm in outstretched right hand and fillet in left, Greek legend "BASILEOS NIKHFOROU ANTIMACOU" around (Bopearachchi Série 1C). *Very fine, rare*.

- 30 Indo Scythians, Azes, Copper Tetradrachm, 10.76g, Obv: Goddess Tyche enthroned left, holding cornucopia, with Greek legend around, Rev: Hermes standing facing, holding caduceus and making benediction gesture, Kharoshthi legend "Maharajasa rajarajasa mahatasa Ayasa" around (of Great King, King of Kings Azes the Great) (HGC 12, 659, Senior 101). *Rare*.

- 31 Kshatrapas of Mathura, Hagamasha, Copper, 4.19g, Obv: Goddess Lakshmi standing facing on satrapal symbol, holding a lotus, tree to right, Brahmi legend "Khatapasa Hagamasha(sa)" around, Rev: Traces of horse symbol (BMC, pl. XXVI, nos. 1-5). *Very Rare*.
The complete legend is visible: Kshatrapas Hagamasha (Satrap Hagamasa).


- 32 Kushans, Huvishka, Gold Dinar, 7.96g, Obv: Crowned Nimbate half bust of Huvishka, with flaming shoulders, arising from the clouds, wearing decorative jacket, holding sceptre and goad, Bactrian legend "SHAONANO SHAO (OOESHKI KOSHANO)" around, Rev: God 'Shaoreoro' (Shahrewar, the deity associated with Mars, War and archetypal Kingship) standing facing left, with Roman style helmet, holding spear and resting his arm on a shield, Bactrian legend "SHAOREORO" to right and Tamgha in left field (Goebel 239A (same dies). *Very fine+ to extremely fine, exceedingly rare*.
An extremely rare variation of 'Shahrewar' type where the God is shown facing left.

- 33 Kushans, Vasishka, Gold Dinar, 7.94g, Obv: King standing to left offering to Fire alter with Bactrian legend around, Rev: God Shiva standing with Nandi bull, holding trident, Bactrian legend "OESHO" in right field and Tamgha in the left. *Very fine, rare*.



- 34 Post-Kushan coinage in Punjab-Haryana, Veerasagra, Copper, 2.39g, Obv: Stylized representation of Shiva reclining against Nandi, partly visible, Rev: Brahmi legend "Shri Veera / Sagra". *Very fine, extremely rare.*
An extremely rare variety in the series also known as 'Kota Kula' – but on this coin there is a no mention of Kota although the general typology is very similar. It is possible that it is a Hunnic issue imitating earlier designs.

- 35 Satavahanas, Siri Satakarni, Nasik Region, Copper, 4.80g, Obv: Lion walking to right bold swastika above, traces of Brahmi legend, Rev: Tree in railing and Ujjaini symbol (I.K. Sharma, Coinage of the Satavahana Empire, pl. VIII). *Fine.*

- 36 Satavahanas, Junnar Region, Potin, 8.68g, Lion type, Obv: Lion standing facing to left, Rev: Four orb Ujjaini symbol. *Fine.*

- 37 Satavahanas, Gautamiputra Siri Yajna Satakarni, Silver Drachma, 2.22g, Portrait type, Obv: Bust with curly long hair & prominent nose and thick lips, wearing a high head ornament, Brahmi legend "Siri Yajna Satakanisa Rajno Gotamiputasa", around, Rev: Four orb Ujjayini symbol, six-arched hill with a crescent, Sun and river flowing below, Southern Brahmi - Tamil-Telugu / Prakrit legends around (Mitch# K&A 156). *Very fine, rare.*

- 38 Satavahanas, Gautamiputra Sri Yajna Satakarni, Lead, 0.75g, Obv: Curly haired bust of king, wearing battle-axe earrings, with Brahmi legend "(Rano Gotami)putasa (Siri Yajna Satakanisa)" around, Rev: 4-orbed Ujjain symbol and traces of legend (Unpublished). *Extremely rare.*
Satavahanas Lead coins with a portrait are incredibly rare. These are not recorded by Mitchiner.

- 39 Western Kshatrapas, Nahapana, Silver Drachmas (6), Obv: Bust of the king facing right, Corrupt Greek legend around, Rev: Thunderbolt, arrow and Brahmi legend "Rajno Kshaharatasa Nahapanasa" (BMC# 243). *Very fine to very fine+. 6 coins.*

- 40 Western Kshatrapas, Damasena, Potin, 1.04g, SE 144, Obv: Elephant standing right, Rev: 3-arched hill topped by crescent, moon left and sun right, Brahmi date 144 below (A. Fishman, The Base-Metal Coinage of the Western Satraps in India, 23.3.144). *Very rare.*
This date Saka Era 144 (222 AD) is rated as RRR by Fishman.

- 41 Hiranyakas of Karnataka, Lead, 10.65g, Obv: Horse standing to right with an earth-ball in its front, Rev: Usual defaced tree in railing. *Very fine.*

- 42 Chutus of Banavasi, Mulanandasa, Lead (2), 16.69g, 16.25g, Obv: Eight-arched hill with circular Brahmi legend, "Rajño Mulanandasa", Rev: Tree in railing in four compartments, Srivatsa symbol to right. *Very fine+. 2 coins.*

- 43 Ishvakus of Andhra, Lead (3), 2.20g, 2.07g, 2.02g, Obv: Elephant facing right, Rev: Four orb symbol. *Very fine+. 3 coins.*

- 44 Kuras of Kolhapur, Maharathi Kura, Lead, 1.57g, "Feudatory issue", Obv: Strung bow and arrow in the centre, Brahmi legend "Maha[rathisa Ku]rasa" around, Rev: Tree in railing with triangle-headed standard as a post-head of railing; wavy line below. *Extremely fine, extremely rare.*

The Kuras assumed coining authority first as feudatories of the Satavahanas during the mid-1st century AD, when the imperial power was weakened. The earliest Kura issues have the legend 'Maharathisa Kurasa'. Generally, they are known as larger denominations. As a fractional issue, this coin is of a high rarity.



This is an unusual type of coin of the Nizam where the name of a Hindu deity is used as a mint-mark or a signifier for an issuer / licensee who farmed the minting rights. The Nizam was reduced to a powerless ruler after his defeat at the battle of Rakshas Bhuvan in 1763. It is difficult to surmise what must have been the reason to include 'Ram' in Devanagari as a mark on coins from the Nizam's principle mint but most likely it must have been a Hindu licensee, or it is also possible that the coins were struck at a Hindu Jagirdar under the Nizam's command with a pseudo-mint name.
