We are extremely delighted to present an extremely important Collection of Coinage in Ancient Deccan. It is broadly divided in the parts - Significant Pre-Satvahana Coins, Hitherto unrecorded Satvahanas coins & Exceptional Satavahana coins. These are cherry picked coins from a serious collection of Shri Chetan Rajapurkar, Nashik.

For unrecorded coins, we have used as reference the corpus of coins appended to Dr. Shailendra Bhandare's PhD Thesis "Historical Analysis of the Satvahanas Era: a Study of Coins". This corpus listed nearly 1500 coins of the Satvahanas period, nearly 75% of which were coins not listed anywhere at the time the thesis was examined. The types unrecorded in the thesis therefore mark a significant advancement in our knowledge about Satavahana coins.

Significant Pre-Satvahanas Coins

The period after the Mauryans and before the Satvahanas in the Deccan is perhaps the most interesting and developing area of Indian numismatics. Characterised by a stunning array of mostly copper and occasional lead issues, the evidence on hand suggests a massive boost in localized coin usage. Most of these coins are die-struck but there is a fair number of punch-marked and cast copper issues known as well. The principle foci of this currency expansion appear to be the Central and Eastern parts of Maharashtra - Marathwada and Vidarbha. Here we witness a steady rise in issue and circulation of mostly uninscribed die-struck copper coins, which depict a host of symbols mainly drawn from religious and cultural contexts that affected the urban centres, which fostered the issue of these coins to serve their tightly operating money economies. However, coins bearing inscriptions soon appear in the melange, pointing to us names of local dynasts, which are not known from any other sources. It was from this group of localized post-Mauryan political entities that the Satavahanas rose to the fore, forming the first indigenous empire to the South of the Narmada.

This depiction is important with regard to the evolution of the iconography of goddess Shri or Lakshmi. Usually, when she is shown in a symbolic form, other elements in the depiction are also symbolic. But here, the incorporation of human figures brings in an interesting anthropomorphism in the scheme.

The symbolic form of Shrivatsa lustrated by elephants is highly important for tracing the iconography of 'Abhisheka Lakshmi'. The depiction here shows the interchangeability of human and symbolic forms of the goddess.

The depiction on obverse is yet another interesting and unusual insight into the evolution of the iconography of the 'Abhisheka' motif and components incorporated within it. Although the overall scheme of the depiction is reminiscent of the 'Abhisheka' of Lakshmi motif, the symbol that occupies centrality is an arrowhead-like emblem. Contextually, it might represent a 'sky' or 'male' equivalent of the 'earth' or 'female' principle, which is usually symbolized by the goddess Shri or Lakshmi.

Apart from the more usual elephant type coins of the region, an extremely rare 'Gajalakshmi' type also comprises the series.

The coins of Kutapada have recently come to light and not yet been published in their entire context. There is a chance that the full legend on coins of this enigmatic type, which shows similarity in fabric and metal to city-state issues of Mahishmati and Tripuri, might be 'Nasike'. If this is the case, the coin becomes extremely significant as the first ever city-state issue from Western Maharashtra. Nasik is regarded as a town of great religious significance and the early evidence of its urban phase has been found in excavations conducted on the banks of the Godavari River at a mound called 'Matichi Gadhi' in 1956-57.

Subena appears to be an independent local ruler in Eastern Vidarbha and his coins show great similarity with those of Suryamitra and Satyabhadra II, the two local rulers. We know Suryamitra was a close contemporary of Satavahana king Satakani. Subena was perhaps a slightly earlier ruler. His name indicates his association with river Bena, which was a major river in the region (present-day Wainganga).

Usabhamita (Sanskrit – *Vrishabhamitra*) is one of the recently discovered '-Mitra' rulers of pre-Satavahana Central Maharashtra, the others being Balamita and Kanhamita. Whether this group of rulers was associated in any way with 'Mitra' rulers of Vidrabha further to the East remains to be ascertained, but the presence of these political entities on the pre-Satvahanas horizon is crucial for understanding the processes of state formation and urbanization in the early centuries BC.

From numismatic evidence, Patalatolata appears to be an independent king contemporary to Satavahana king Satakani. It is very rare to find a fractional issue with full typological details visible, as they are on this specimen.

Viga (Vigraha) was evidently yet another of the independent pre-Satvahanas ruler of Central Maharashtra who appears to have extended his sway into the territories held by king Sebaka to the East. This is evident from the similarity in the coins of these two rulers. On this particular coin the bull is shown distinctly with a raised tail, which in all likelihood suggests the ritual 'letting free' of the animal, as prescribed in the 'Vrishotsarja' sacrifice.

Satyabhadra II was a later 'Bhadra' ruler than Satyabhadra I, who issued coins of completely different types, sometimes counterstriking the issues of Damabhadra. In all likelihood, Satyabhadra II was a close contemporary of Dharmabhadra, whose coins were counterstruck by Satakani. This suggests the chronological placement of Satyabhadra II was just before Satakani and he might have been a contemporary of the first Satavahana king, Simuka.

The coin, although uninscribed, is significant for both obverse and reverse motifs. The motif of a chariot is seen on some other rare examples of uninscribed pre-Satvahanas die-struck issues from Maharashtra. It is attested in the *Shri Sukta*, the hymn dedicated to goddess Shri, which occurs in the interpolated 'appendix' section of the Rg Veda, that Shri in her solar form / connection is associated with Usha, or the morning light, and arrives at daybreak riding a chariot. It is likely that the depiction of the chariot and its riders refers to this form of Shri or Lakshmi, rather than a royal portraiture. The symbol on the reverse is unique in the entire repertoire of Indian numismatic symbols – a Damaru enclosing a taurine is seen on some coins in the copper punch-marked series of Vidisha, but only as a single symbol and not in such a complex arrangement.

Hitherto Unrecorded Satvahanas Coins

The following group of coins represents new types and / or significantly different varieties in the known types of Satvahanas coinage. The base catalogue used here is the corpus of coins appended to Shailendra Bhandare's PhD Thesis 'Historical Analysis of the Satvahanas Era: a Study of Coins'. This corpus listed nearly 1500 coins of the Satvahanas period, nearly 75% of which were coins not listed anywhere at the time the thesis was examined. Since then, the discovery of entirely new types has been scant and therefore this group marks an important update on the corpus. Mostly, these coins are dated to the early or 'first phase' of Satvahanas rule, prior to c.50AD. Some of these coins, alongside those offered in the next section, throw important light on the intra-regional numismatic chronologies of the types.

So far, 'Abhisheka Lakshmi' type coins of Siri Satakani are known from Junnar (rectangular, alloyed copper) and Newase-Paithan (round, lead) regions. On the former, the goddess is shown seated in a yogic posture, while on the latter she is shown standing frontally. This coin represents a completely different and distinct type from these two known varieties. Here is goddess is seated cross-legged and since the coin is round and of lead, it brings together different features than those known earlier. The reverse bears similarity with the Junnar type, so it is likely that this new type should also be assigned to the same region.

Many 'elephant' type coins from Nasik region depict the animal walking to right but all have a tree-in-railing and a modified 'Ujjain' symbol on the reverse. This coin is unique in the sense that it has only the 'Ujjain' symbol on the reverse and it is executed in a unique fashion as well.

The known coins of Chhimuka II in the 'Junnar lion' type are exceedingly rare and can be counted on fingers of a hand. The relationship between Satakani and Chhimuka II is clearly illustrated through this coin and it is evident that the chronological difference between the two cannot be very much as the execution of their coins is almost identical. Similar inference could also be drawn from coins excavated at Kotalingala. These coins therefore serve as a substantiation of two rulers named 'Chhimuka' in the Satavahana dynasty, Chhimuka II being distinct than Chhimuka / Simuka the originator of the dynasty.

No coins of Kosikiputa Siri Satakani of the Nasik Elephant type were documented before. This coin is typologically very similar to the issues of Kochhiputa Satakani, Gotamiputa Siri Satakani and the Kshaharata Kshatrapa Nahapana, suggesting a close chronological alignment between these rulers.

The Kumaras under Isamula extended their sway into the region of Junnar taking advantage of the Kshaharata – Satavahana conflict in mid-1st century AD. Although most coins of this opportunist king mention his name as 'Kumara Isamula', rare examples also bear a truncated version, 'Kumara Mula'. The fact that the coin is countermarked by a Swastika suggests its revalidation perhaps under the Satavahanas, when the region was cleared of Kshaharata occupation towards the end of the 1st century AD.

The last two letters identify this coin to be an issue of Vasithiputa Siri Satakani and it follows in type and fabric from the issues of his predecessor, Vasithiputa Siri Pulumavi. At this time, the regiospecific character of Satavahana coinage had begun diminishing in Maharashtra Deccan. Soon, the 'universal' elephant type coins in potin became the hallmark of Satavahana currency.

Exceptional Satavahana Coins

Offered hereunder are Satavahana coins of documented types but of an exceptional character, either by the virtue of their overall condition, or by their execution, or by the general importance the types carry. The joint issues of Satakani and Naganika, as well as some of the known but rare and sought after 'Abhisheka Lakshmi' types, are included in this group.

Vasithiputa Siri Chhimuka, the progenitor of the Satavahana dynasty, is mainly known from his 'elephant' type coins from Newase-Paithan region. However, the other most numerous type from this region is the 'bull' type, which is known bearing the legends 'Satavahana' and 'Satakani'. As this coin demonstrates, we have evidence that both these were initiated under Chhimuka

The coins of Naganika and Satakani are a unique type amongst all Indian monarchical coinages, in being the first ever joint issue and the earliest to bear the name of an indigenous queen. It is well-known from the Naneghat inscription that Naganika was not only the consort of Siri Satakani, but a ruler in her own right, after her husband's death, as a regent for their son Vedi Siri. She performed many Vedic sacrifices as Satakani's consort, including Ashwamedha or the Horse Sacrifice. The depiction of a horse-headed pillar on coins very likely refer to this event, and the pillar is undoubtedly a sacrificial post with her name inscribed on it, alluding to the fact that she held an equal status in the ceremony along with her husband.

As a result, the Satvahanas focus gradually shifted to Andhra where the dynasty flourished for another hundred or so years.

The Nolambas were the powerful feudatories to several overlords of Karnataka in the 9th and 11th century CE. They ruled for nearly 350 years from Hemavati, their capital, now in Anantapur district of modern Andhra Pradesh. For a brief period of about 50 years, they even ruled Bengaluru. Their coins are striking, magnificent and are constantly sought after by the collector community. The legend "Lenkka" in a broad term means commander in chief. The eight peripheral punches represent eight lobes of the Lotus, the symbol of Goddess of wealth, and hence the coins are often known as Padma Tanka.

During the siege, two types of coins appear to have been issued, either by the Mughals to pay the troops, or by Sidi Masud, to mark his acceptance of the Mughal suzerainty. One of them has the mint-name 'Dar al-Zafar Qila'a Advani' while the other has only 'Adoni'. Both are extremely rare, only known from 3-4 extant pieces. This coin combines the two reverses with mint-names and thus is a mule but bringing together reverse dies of a short-lived issue. Soon afterwards Adoni was renamed 'Imtiyazgarh' and became a fairly productive mint under the rule of local Nawabs.
